SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The two key areas of our School Improvement agenda this year are:

- Raising Attainment in Numeracy and Literacy
- Improving Mental Health and Wellbeing

Further information can be found on the school website which details both our Standards and Quality Report for last year and this year's School Improvement Plan.

You will also find our PEF (Pupil Equity Fund) plan, which details how we intend to close the poverty gap using money awarded to schools based on the % of children who live within Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation decile 1 and 2. Our school was awarded £21,600 to support targeted pupils. We have used some of this funding to employ a Pupil Support Assistant to work with these pupils developing a range of skills.

SCHOOL ATTAINMENT AND ACHIEVEMENT

The table below outlines our attainment data from 2016/2017. The percentages indicate how many pupils have achieved a specific level at milestone years. These are seen in general terms as some pupils can achieve the below levels sooner or later than those indicated in P1, P4 and P7.

Primary 6 and 7 children are working towards their JASS award scheme. The JASS Programme is designed to support children through the transition from primary to secondary education. This Award is fully funded by The Parent Council and is closely linked to the Duke of Edinburgh Award. This involves participating and volunteering within their community. Unfortunately, I have raised this issue once again with your Parent Council, highlighting how disappointed I am of the continuing disregard SOME parents have and the manner in which they communicate in front of their children with members of staff on being told that they should not be parking there. I have therefore no alternative that if there is not a significant improvement by the end of next term, access to the school playground via the gate beside the nursery will no longer be in use. The two main gates into the playground will be the only access points for children. The safety of all children at Hazlehead remains my utmost priority and I will not have this comprised on a daily basis and see an avoidable accident occur.
