

P4H Term 4 Overview

We have a very busy and exciting Summer term planned for the pupils in Primary 4H. Here is a summary of the planned learning:

Literacy/Languages	Writing: We will be looking at report writing and imaginative writing. Spelling: We will be revisiting sounds, common words and prefixes/suffixes. Reading: Pupils will be reading in groups, with a focus on comprehension. There will be a mix of fiction and nonfiction texts. We will also have a strong focus on using non-fiction books for research. Accelerated reader: Pupils will be encouraged to increase their comprehension skills through the Accelerated Reader Programme. There will be opportunities to read their home readers in class each day. Grammar: Vocabulary/Connectives/Openers/Punctuation/Handwriting French: We will be focusing on the body, food and personal information.
Numeracy	We will have a focus on measure and angles/grid reference. There will be a constant emphasis on number and mental maths.
Health and Wellbeing	PE: There will be a focus on athletics and rounders during summer term. Health: There will be a focus on reflective practice, public speaking and resilience.
Expressive Arts	We will be exploring our IDL through art, music with Mrs Fisher and the use of technology to create artwork for information.
Technologies	There will be a focus on Google Slides and creating documents using technology.
RME	We will be revisiting Buddhism, looking at the practices and traditions of the religion.

This term, the Primary 4 Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL) topic is: World's Wackiest Weather

- PE kits should be brought in on Monday and taken home on Friday to be washed.
- Homework will be given on a Thursday and returned for the following Tuesday.
- Spelling words are developed on Monday and practised throughout the week. The pupils will receive their spelling words on a Monday via Google Classroom, before the spelling test on Friday. Children are encouraged to practice at home, but are not required to submit anything.
- Assembly will take place on Wednesday and the Ethos block is on a Friday.
- Please help your child develop their personal organisation by encouraging them to use their homework diary every day.
- Children are encouraged to bring a personal reading book into class. Books can also be signed out from the School Library. We will visit the library on a Monday morning.
